## Councillor Report Karen Telford, Vice – Chair

**Meetings/Updates** After the June 18th Bi-Election I was sworn in on June 25th, I have comprised a list of meetings that I have attended and a brief summary of each. If you would like to have a more in depth conversation, or further information please feel free to contact me. There is a lot to learn coming in half way in to the term and I am doing my best to update myself and learn about everything. I have also taken on the role of Vice-Chair and I am enjoying it and enjoying my role on council.

June 25/19 – Swearing in ceremony and re-organization meeting June 26/19 – Attended the Consultation meeting with Alberta Forestry; Overview of Alberta Forestry Consultation Process, Fire Smart Grant (Fireguard). I am an alternate to this committee, and learning about the consultation process. June 27/19 – I attended the Harvesting Committee meeting as I am the alternate on this committee. There are still negotiations ongoing with the GOA to prepare for the September 1st implementation date; there will be an application and eligibility process to be recognized as a Metis Harvester. July 2/19 – Regular Council Meeting July 3-5/19 – MSGC Pre-Board Meeting, TAG/Reconciliation Secretariat Meetings: Governance Funding (TAG= Treaty Aboriginal Government, Section 35 Rights). July 9/19 – Meeting with Jamie of Blue Source & Climate Change Department regarding carbon capture and environmental impacts (leave forest basically as is) July 9/19 – Reviewed and updated a few Policies with Administration & Council July 9/19 – Community Meeting in the evening; general discussions on Education/Cultural Society, Honoring Life Grant, Senior Abuse, Stolen Vehicles, Prevention & Programming for Youth, Safe Homes/Group Homes, Family Friend, Health Care Aide, Pasture (Agriculture Society), High Crime Homes, Beaver Problems, 4-H Program July 10/19 – MSGC/Federal Reconciliation Secretariat/Alberta Meeting – Metis Settlements Governance Funding Discussion Items: 5 Million Request Update, Proposals for Governance Funding, Accessibility to Existing Metis Funding Arrangements. We were advised there is no funding available this fiscal year for Metis Settlements, although MNC/Metis Nation has received funding in the 2017, 2018 & 2019 federal budgets. We are continuing to push for long-term sustainable funding for the Metis Settlements. July 11/19 – Landfill Meeting with Elizabeth, Administration Staff & Associated Engineering, motion requested to move forward with landfill site that was selected. July 12/19 – Calgary – Meeting with Karmen (Oil Haul) Harvest Operations Corp. only 2 operating wells in Fishing Lake a lot of changes recently, discussed status of Master Service Agreement and FLMS Rates. July 15/19 – Regular Council Meeting July 19-20/19 – Back to Batoche - Participated in Grand Entry, met Federal Ministers and other Metis Politicians to raise awareness of the Métis Settlements. July 22/19 – Entities Meeting – Oil Haul & Homeland only as Lakeland Asphalt was not available. July 22/19 – Community Meeting cancelled, myself & Chair had informal discussions with members present. July 23/19 – Met with Ryan of International Petrol (Former Black Pearl), updates and discussion July 26/19 – Meeting with Bill McElhanney, Lawyer regarding CNRL's legal challenge July 29/19 – Meeting with Lakeland Asphalt Manager regarding work updates, etc. July 30/19 – Met with 3D Energy and A&E regarding preliminary design concepts for old administration building. Aug 1/19 – MSGC Governance Committee Meeting – Topics for discussions; Settlement Controlled Business Policy, Review of Deliverables from the Current Grant/Contribution Agreement, JARC (Joint Accountability Review Committee), Councillor Remuneration Policy Aug 1/19 – Discussions with MSGC Executive, Elizabeth and Town of Bonnyville regarding ID349 Air Weapons Range. Aug 7 & 8/19 – MSGC Assembly & Meeting with Indigenous Affairs Minister Rick Wilson. Agenda: Draft General Council Membership Policy – 1st Reading (**Passed**), Executive Community Tours (Membership Policy)-no dates yet, Land & Membership Issue (Paddle Prairie), GC Budget Amendment (**Passed**), Metis Settlements Housing Authority Policy & Procedure Approval (**Passed**), Minister of Indigenous Relations – Indigenous Opportunity Fund (IOF)/Community Member – Discussion & Input as the Province is developing a Terms of Reference for the IOF and seeking input from MSGC, Harvesting Committee – Have been meeting with GOA on implementation of the Harvesting Agreement & Policy (**Passed**), LTA Exit Strategy – LTA Expires in 2023, discussion regarding next steps, MSA Amendments, for discussion. Also had a flag raising ceremony outside the GC Office. Aug 14/19 – Presentation by MPG in Sherwood Park and discussions, potential next steps will be to invite to community for RCM and General Meeting. Aug 15/19 – MSGC Economic Development Assembly – The Collaborative Project & SPI Renewal (Strategy Partnership Initiative) Overview and Status of the MSGC/NRCan(Natural Resource Canada) SPI Agreement, currently Fishing Lake is one of the 5 Settlements who put forward interest. This is an opportunity to effect positive change in Economic Development through collaboration and support for business planning, feasibility and accessing capital and other resources if ready.

I will try to submit a monthly, or bi-monthly report to update membership on what meetings I have attended on and off Settlement. As per the procedural by-law there are no community meetings in August.
