The first 9 questions pertain to removal of outdated Provisions

Then a question concerning the removal of the Minister from having a say in Financial Allocation Policies FAPs

Then 3 proposed amendments that will improve governance.

We will then ask a question for general feedback on the proposed control of the Metis Settlements Land Registry by the Metis Settlements General Council.

* 1. Section 111 (b) refers to the Co-Management agreement - **Remove** - "before it is signed"
